Year 7 Literacy and Numeracy Catch Up Plan 2019-20

The literacy and numeracy catch up premium gives schools additional funding to support year 7 students who did not achieve the expected level (score of 100) in reading and/or maths at the end of key stage 2 (KS2). Hellesdon High School receives approximately £20,000 to support these students. We run several programmes to support these students based on individual needs.
